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Mayans are known to have been inhabited Cozumel since 300 A.D. through the height of the Mayan empire on the island became an important port for trade because of its strategic location between Honduras and Veracruz.

The Mayans believed that Cozumel was the spiritual home of lxchel, the Mayan Goddess of fertility and love, and Mayan women are said to have journeyed from all parts of the vast Mayan empire to worship at her shrines on the island. In fact, the name Cozumel comes from the Mayan word "Cuzamil-Pectin" or "Land of the Swallows" because, as legend has it, she thanked the women for dedicating temples here to her by sending her favorite bird as a sign of gratitude.

By 1570 a smallpox epidemic, another humanitarian legacy from Cortes, had reduced the Mayan population to less than 300 and by 1600 the island was virtually deserted making it an ideal base for pirates who terrorized the Caribbean during the 17th and 18th centuries

Over the next hundred years the little town of San Miguel developed into a small, relatively prosperous fishing village until the early 60's when it was discovered by explorer and documentary film maker Jacque Cousteau who put it on the map as one of the greatest diving destinations in the world.



CULTURE







From the moment you arrive, you'll feel the warmth of our people. Because in Cozumel, hospitality isn't simply a practice, it's a belief. And its roots stretch deep into the days of the Maya.

The culture of Cozumel is highly unique, in that it combines ancient Mayan traditional culture with modern Mexican culture, modern Caribbean culture and the unique culture of an area devoted almost entirely to tourism. In some ways, Cozumel is timeless, with ancient ruins, small village habits and modern resorts all standing side-by-side in a small geographic area bounded by gorgeous beaches.

If you happen to be visiting The wonderful island during local festivities such as **El Carnaval** (February), **El Cedral** (May) or **saint Michael Archangel** (September) don't be shy, join us and be part of Cozumel magical history and traditions.

ECOLOGY

Cozumel is just 30 miles from north to south and 10 miles from east to west, so you can easily explore the island on your visit. But within its sandy borders, there is so much to fall in love with.

On average, the island stays around a blissful 80 degrees. The summers are slightly warmer, ranging in the mid-80s to 90s and the winters cool to the mid-70s. It's always a beach day in Cozumel, as the water ranges from a warm 77 to 82 degrees throughout the year.

Cozumel is home to the largest reef system in the Americas, the Mesoamerican Reef. Teeming with hundreds of tropical fish, turtles and other vibrant sea life, it is truly a diver's dream. But even if you don't explore down into the depths of the ocean, there is much to see for snorkelers too. There are as many as 250 different species of tropical fish including the queen angelfish and the illusive toadfish, seen nowhere else in the world.

Above the sparkling surface of the water, the trees are speckled with frigate birds, brown pelicans, olivaceous cormorants and others. If you look closely, you may catch a glimpse of a tree frog, a crocodile or the prehistoric iguana resting in the lush vegetation. But no worries, our locals are the friendliest in the world.

The Cozumel International Airport is located on 65 Avenida and Boulevard Aeropuerto, less than a 5-minute drive to the downtown area.

Airport-to-hotel transportation is concessioned to private companies for better service and they use only Shared Vans. No private taxi services are available.

NOTE:

Upon your arrival you may encounter tourist advisory staff. They might try to sell you a timeshare. They are not part of the tourism department of the Island.

You can also rent a car at the airport. If you do have a car, all you need to do is get a printed local guide of the island to find your way around. Driving in Cozumel is very easy.

FROM CANCUN

AIR SHUTTLE



Just a 20-minutes ride aboard Mavair, with 5 daily round trip flights in comfortable 19 passenger aircrafts. Flights start as early as 7:00 am from Cozumel to Cancun to as late as 7:00pm from Cancun to Cozumel, every two odd hours from Cancun and every two even hours from Cozumel. Mayair also services all the southeast of Mexico, on one daily basis round trip flight, departing from Cozumel to Veracruz via Cancun, Merida and Villahermosa.

BY FERRY WITH CAR



The first thing you need to do is reach Punta Venado, the address is: Carretera Tulum - Playa del Carmen Km. 282 + 600 just behind Xcaret Park and 15 minutes from Playa del Carmen.

When you enter you will see a line of vehicles that are going to cross to Isla Cozumel by the ferry, the name of the Ferry is Transcaribe

You need to be 1 hour before of the schedule time.

FERRY COZUMEL-PLAYA DEL CARMEN



With their new fast boats, regular schedules and convenient service, you can be in Cozumel in 30 minutes departing from Playa del Carmen starting as early as 6:00 am from Cozumel to as late as 10:00 pm from Plava del Carmen.

You may buy your tickets right before you depart, or they can be bought in advance. Space on the boats is ample so you do not have to worry about availability. The approximate cost for a roundtrip Playa del Carmen-Cozumel-Playa del Carmen is about \$ 326.00 MX Pesos for adults and \$ 194.00 MX Pesos for Children (6-11 years).

During the ride you will be able to watch TV ads of Cozumel and Playa del Carmen, which contain useful information on both places, and in most boats you can also sit outside and enjoy the scenery.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION



There are new modern buses called **ADO** to Plava del Carmen for your trip south to Playa del Carmen. Fare is about \$10 US each way, this will take you about 45 minutes. In Playa del Carmen the Ferry pier is located 2 blocks away from the bus terminal.

Enjoy the magic on board a real US Coast Guard Certified submarine as you make the underwater journey into Cozumel's waters. **Dive to 100 ft. underwater** and enjoy the magic onboard a real US Coast Guard Certified submarine as you make the underwater journey to Chankanaab, an environmentally protected marine park, home to amazing coral formations and a variety of marine animals.

You will cruise the ocean floor as no one else will at the island's most famous and unique attraction, Chankanaab. An environmentally protected marine park, Chankanaab is home to a huge variety of sea life until now seen only by divers. Your submarine dive adventure begins on board ferry vessel Ana that will take you on a 12 minute cruise along Cozumel's west coast.

Marvel at the huge variety of tropical fish including parrotfish, grunts, and groupers as your captain expertly navigates through magnificent 30 foot coral heads, all in air-conditioned comfort.

Throughout your voyage an informative, live narration is provided by an experienced co-pilot who will be happy to answer any questions. You will not want to forget your cameras for an once-in-a-lifetime glance into this amazing undersea world. After your 40-minute dive the submarine will resurface where the ferry vessel is waiting to return you to the Atlantis Ticket Office and ground transportation.





If you're a wildlife lover, a trip to Faro Celerain Eco Park is a must. Also known as Parque Punta Sur, this sprawls across the southern tip of Cozumel. Its 2,500 acres shelter a variety of indigenous species, including exotic birds and crocodiles, not to mention sea turtles. But don't let the animals distract you from everything else the park has to offer. Take some time to explore the El Caracol Mayan ruins and the Faro Celerain Lighthouse, where you'll find a small maritime museum. Also, make sure to pack a swimsuit and enjoy the calmer waters of the Laguna Colombia.

To make the most of your visit, stop by the visitor's center where you'll encounter an onslaught of information. Many recent visitors recommend **taking a catamaran or kayak tour** of the Laguna Colombia.

Dive in for a guided snorkel tour in the crystal clear waters of the Caribbean and explore tropical fish and marine life as well as coral reef formations under the watchful eye of our PADI-certified snorkeling guide!



The Submarine Atlantis XII is the only tourism submersible in Mexico. Come visit our family friendly, state-of-Art vessel and marvel with the depths of the Caribbean as a myriad of marine creatures appear through large viewports. Coral reefs are the playground for thousands of fish, lobsters, rays, sharks and turtles that you can admire, depending on season. This ride will take you to a breath-taking scenario at the famous Cozumel Wall, an 1800 feet drop off that limits the Island of Cozumel.

The newest Submarine Route explores the biggest dive wreck in the area, Felipe Xicotencatl, a 154 feet ship sank in 2000 for the purpose to enhance marine life in Cozumel coral reefs. Formerly it was a minesweeper for the Us Navy, and sold to Mexican Navy in 1962 for rescue and patrolling missions. Shipwreck lies from 55 to 80 feet depth and homes fish, sponges, and soft corals, mainly.

Our submarine is battery powered, air conditioned, and free of any pressure issues. The expert crew enhances your Unique Underwater Adventure with a life narration. All too soon Submarine Pilot will surface the submarine and tender Ana will bring Explorers back to pier while enjoying complementary rum punch.

Dine out on their patio. Nice for an evening meal, but I've enjoyed a number of lunches there too. Their "puffy" garlic bread is delicious and I order it every time I eat there. The sangria is wonderful. They now take both Visa and MasterCard.

There is an area just inside that is air conditioned, but I normally sit out on the patio in the evening. They have some unusual beers...I recently tried a fruit flavored beer and it was delicious.

OPEN Monday-Saturday, from 11am to 11pm.

WET WENDY'S

I do love their margaritas. On the rocks or frozen, and they make some very unusual flavors. The menu includes everything from hamburgers, onion rings and fries to Mexican and TexMex dishes. They have vegetarian fare plus ribs and chicken dishes. Try something with their mango chipotle sauce, or how about one of their great burritos? In the pedestrian area of the downtown square on Ave. 5 between Juarez and Calle 2. If you are standing in the square at the big clock tower with your back to the ocean you are on Ave. 5. Go to the left across Juarez and about a 1/2 block later on the left you'll see the tables and umbrellas.

OPEN about 11am

ROCK N JAVA CAFE

Quite good and reasonable prices. My favorites are the croissant sandwiches and they make wonderful desserts you just won't believe. (German chocolate cake, pecan pie, fudge brownies, banana muffins, cherry cheesecake, etc.) Great iced cappuccino too. They have a good selection of vegetarian dishes. On Melgar, the main waterfront street, south of the new Punta Langosta Plaza. They have also opened a Sushi and Thai Noodle Bar that is now downstairs in the Mega grocery store mall. A great idea for take-out. Order first, do your grocery shopping and then pick up your order to go.

CHI

Another choice that's among my favorites Chi Chinese Restaurant and Bar. It's upstairs at the corner of Melgar (the oceanfront street) and Calle 3. The entrance and stairs are on Calle 3, just before you get to Pizza Hut. Dine inside in air conditioning or you can choose to dine outside. You'll have a wonderful ocean view and superb food. It's a great success!. There is now a second location of Chi, and it's on the second floor of the tall building right across from Puerta Maya cruise ship pier.

OPEN Monday- Sunday, all you can eat buffet at 12 noon.

LAS PALMERAS

Right across the street from the ocean in the middle of town, this restaurant is almost directly across from the ferry to the mainland. Good food, and it's presented well.

Good margaritas, good guacamole and salsa. The hamburgers here have a charcoal grilled taste and I really like that. Very much a tourist spot, but still good.

GUIDO'S DELI

Guido's Deli is at the corner of Ave. 15 and Calle 10. They are open from 8:30am til 5pm and serve breakfast, brunch and lunch. Also, they have a deli filled with marvelous goodies that you can purchase and take home with you. The garden area where you can sit and eat is charming and they normally have a lunch special each day. Their quiche is very good (the bacon onion is my favorite) plus sandwiches, soups, etc.

EL MUSEO

On the main waterfront street (Ave. Rafael Melgar) north of the main plaza, on the second floor covered terrace of the museum. You'll enjoy a beautiful view of the water and the breeze is lovely. It's a wonderful places to go for breakfast and the prices are reasonable.

Great banana pancakes. Although they do serve sandwiches, etc. for lunch they serve breakfast the entire time they are open. Open from 7am to 2pm.

AMERICAN FAST FOOD

Just in case you get a craving (or your kids do) for Burger King, a Subway sandwich, Domino's pizza or Pizza Hut when you're visiting Cozumel, we do have all these here.

Other American franchises now on Cozumel include Starbucks and Hooters.

DEL SUR

Del Sur is now on the corner of Calle 3 and Ave. 5. They make Argentinean empanadas (empanadas are like little turnovers in a pastry shell). I can't list all the varieties they have but I tried the beef with spices; the cheese, tomato and basil and the cheese, bacon and plum. Just recently had the cheese, pepperoni and jalapeno and I like that too. All are delicious and they have wonderful salads, excellent chicken and beef. Their dessert menu includes a fantastic banana/chocolate empanada but my favorite for dessert is apple/cinnamon. T OPEN about 5pm.

CASA DENIS

Downtown on the main square. The food is good and their prices very reasonable. Took a group of 8 and everyone was pleased with their selections. We included a wide range of tastes, from a 3 year old to those of us that love highly seasoned foods. We dined at the tables outside to enjoy the breeze. Located on the right side of the main plaza square, in the second block back. This is one of the oldest restaurants on Cozumel and it's a family tradition.

Here is a listing of Cozumel hospitals. All doctors, hospitals or medical facilities, public or private, will require full payment for services to be rendered, in cash or by credit card, at the time of service. Most are NOT able to bill your US insurance company for payment. Rather, they will give you receipts for your payment so you may request reimbursement from your U.S. insurance carrier; be sure to get an itemized bill. We have had many cases of U.S. citizens not allowed to discharge from local hospitals until payment is made in full. If you believe you are being charged unfairly, you may contact the Mexican government consumer rights protection agency, **PROFECO or call 01-800-468-8722 and ask for an English-speaking operator).**

Medicare and Medicaid will generally **NOT** cover medical expenses incurred outside of the U.S. For more information, please visit the Official Medicare website and the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Many policies do **NOT** cover costs of air ambulance service. Additional insurance that will cover air ambulance/medevac service is strongly recommended for all travelers. It is a good idea to get a 24/7 phone number from your insurance carrier.

The area code for Cozumel phone numbers is **987**. To call from the U.S. to land lines in Mexico, **dial 011-52-** and the area code and number. For example, to call the BMM SSS Clinic from the U.S. dial **011-52-987-872-1430**. To call from the U.S. to cell phones in Mexico, dial **011-521-** and the area code and number. If the call does not go through, dial **011-52-** and the area code and the number as it may be a Nextel cell phone, which acts as a land line.
